- Cancellation policy- 48 hours ahead.
- Cancellation fee - a night rate for room only.
- Check in time - 14:00.
- Check out - 12:00; on Fridays - 10:00.

**The rooms were reserved for the conference participants from May 31<sup>st</sup> if you wish to reserve a room earlier - we have available rooms starting May 27<sup>th</sup>.**

### **Arrival:**

When arriving from the airport, please ask the driver to take you to the Maiersdorf Faculty Club at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem on Mount Scopus (“Har Hatsofim”). Give the driver the following information, according to type of taxi and time of arrival:

1. If you arrive between midnight and 6:30 AM: Please ask the driver to take you to “sha’ar chatzot”, the “midnight gate” – the driver will take a right at the tunnel (the “minhara”), drive a very short distance on the road which goes around the campus, and to “sha’ar chatzot”, which will be the second gate on the left (there will also be signs indicating the direction to Maiersdorf Faculty Club). At the gate there is an intercom which connects to the Maiersdorf Faculty Club. Please use the intercom and you will be let in by the attendant.

2. If you arrive by regular taxi or car from 6:30 AM until midnight: Please tell the driver to enter at the Faculty of Humanities gate and continue up to Level 1 of the parking lot. From there you can enter the Maiersdorf Faculty Club. Take the elevator up to the third floor to reach the reception desk.

3. If you arrive by “Nesher” Sherut (a shared taxi company from the airport) from 6:30 AM until midnight: Please tell the driver to enter through the tunnel (the “minhara”), and continue a bit past where the buses stop to let off passengers. There, on the right, you will see a sign that says “Maiersdorf Faculty Club” with an intercom. Please use the intercom and you will be let in by the attendant.

Please note that the entrance to the Maiersdorf Faculty Club on Saturday is different than on other days. For arrival on Saturday, please follow the directions for arrival between midnight and 6:30 AM on a regular day (you must use the “midnight gate” and the intercom there).

We know that this may sound complicated, but most taxi drivers are familiar with the procedure. This guide is just to make sure that everything goes smoothly for you!
